What is a health disparity?

- A difference in health between groups that is linked to social or economic disadvantage
- These groups are defined by race or ethnicity, religion, socioeconomic status, gender, mental health, sexual orientation, or geographic location

Border region disadvantages

If a state, the border would rank:

- 51st in
 - Per capita income¹
 - High school completion²
 - EPA grants to states
 - Access to health care
 - Health care professionals per capita
- 1st in
 - Unemployment³
 - Numbers of school children living in poverty
 - Numbers of children who are uninsured



Health disparities in the region

- Infectious disease: TB, hepatitis A, STDs
- Chronic disease: Diabetes; obesity; cancers of the colon, breast, cervix; asthma; dental disease; heart disease
- Injuries: Motor vehicle crashes, drugs, falls
- Violence and mental health: Intimate partner violence (IPV), depression, suicide
- Maternal and child health: Teen birth, preterm birth
- Health services: Vaccine coverage, prenatal care



Health disparities are complex

- Resolving health disparities requires understanding the root causes and how they interact to influence health:
 - Biology and genetics
 - Individual behavior
 - Social environment
 - Physical environment
 - Health Services
- Novel and interdisciplinary approaches are needed
